Voting Process (and Member Eligibility Requirements) At General Membership Meeting, September 19

(Please note: According to our bylaws, voters must be active ATV MN members -- and for at least 90 days prior to the election -- in order to be eligible and receive a ballot.)

Following the publication in the ATV MN newsletter of the profiles of members on the ballot for the fall election, the ATV MN office received phone calls from members, with questions about the voting process — scheduled for the general membership meeting at Ride & Rally on September 19th — and requirements to be eligible to vote.

The ATV MN executive board reviewed the ATV MN bylaws. Here is an update from the board, to avoid confusion, and to ensure the voting process is efficient and follows the ATV MN bylaws at Ride & Rally.

- **Membership Requirement:** Per long-standing ATV MN bylaws, voters must be active members for at least 90 days prior to the election. To vote on September 19th, members must have joined or renewed an expired membership on or before June 22nd, 2026. Anyone not in the database by this date will not be eligible to vote.

- **Please Preregister For Ride & Rally:** We encourage members who plan to attend Ride & Rally, participate on the rides, and attend the Saturday banquet

and membership meeting, to preregister at atvmn.org, so we have a good headcount for the dinner, and so we can verify eligibility for voting in advance and avoid delays at the meeting. All members attending the banquet and general membership meeting must register in order to receive a wristband for dinner and another one to vote if eligible.

- **Members coming to vote only.** Qualifying ATV MN members who wish to vote, but are not registering for Ride & Rally or attending the banquet, should register Saturday evening at the event, in order to receive a wristband to confirm they are eligible to vote. There is no fee for any member in order to vote in the ATV MN election.

- **One vote per member.** According to existing bylaws, eligible members, if present, have one vote. Family memberships provide for two votes. If both are present, the listed member, and spouse or significant other, have one vote each. Business members have one vote, if present (but can't combine votes with regular membership vote). One vote per member, no matter how many ATV clubs they belong to.

- **Voting Schedule:** Voting will take place on Saturday evening during the General Membership meeting, in a separate room from the banquet, from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Voting ballots will be presented to eligible members during the assigned voting period. The election committee will count the votes and announce the results before the meeting concludes.

If possible, please bring your ATV MN membership card, or membership number (found on the cover of your Minnesota Wheelin magazine's mailing label). That will help keep the voter registration line moving. Thanks for your help and cooperation in order to make the voting process as smooth as possible.

**Get To Know The Candidates For
The ATV Minnesota Executive
Board Election, To Be Held At
Ride & Rally**

*(Repeated from the August 4th
newsletter, so all members are
informed)*

The terms for three ATV Minnesota executive board positions expire in September: President, First Vice President, and Secretary.

The deadline for nominations was July 31st. Nominations were made using the official ATV MN nomination form, found at atvmn.org. Four nominations were submitted.

The nominees were contacted to confirm their interest. Nominations were reviewed and verified before being placed on the ballot.

The election will be held at the 2026 ATV MN State Convention/Ride & Rally, during the General Membership Meeting on September 19th. All candidates must be nominated. During the meeting, there will be no nominations accepted from the floor, and no write-in votes will be accepted or counted. Below are the candidate profiles provided to ATV Minnesota.



Larry Folstad, Running For ATV MN President

Experience in the sport of ATVing

Like many riders, I started in the 1980s on three-wheelers, riding old logging roads, abandoned railroad grades, and informal trails. Later, I moved to Class 1 ATVs and watched dedicated trail systems take shape. Today, I ride a Class 2 side-by-side. The machines have changed dramatically over the years, but my enjoyment and passion for the sport remain high.

Experience with ATV Minnesota

Working alongside ATV Minnesota, I was one of the leaders who partnered with St. Louis and Itasca Counties to help open lower-volume county roads for ATV travel, creating vital trail connectivity. I also helped develop the policies that enabled cities to open their streets to ATVs and become ATV-friendly communities. These efforts required collaboration with local governments, clubs, and stakeholders and have helped expand responsible riding opportunities across Minnesota.

Involvement with ATV clubs

I remember the early days of the Northern Traxx ATV Club in 2001, when it was just a few informational meetings. In 2003, we incorporated as a nonprofit, and today the club has grown to nearly 400 members. Over the years, I've also helped other clubs get started, including the Carlton County Riders and the Alborn Dirt Devils, both of which have become successful, active clubs. I continue to stay involved at the local, regional, and state levels.

Reasons for seeking this office

I am seeking the office of President because I care deeply about the future of ATV MN and the sport we've all worked so hard to build. After more than 25 years of watching this organization and our trail system grow, I want to help lead the next chapter of trail building and maintenance. I also want to be actively involved in seeking additional funding through the Legislative process.

Personal qualifications that apply to the responsibilities of the office

My greatest strengths are leadership, relationship building, and the ability to bring people together to achieve common goals. My background in management and team building has provided me with decades of experience leading organizations, building consensus, and successfully guiding projects from concept to completion. For more than 25 years, I've been actively involved in the growth and evolution of the ATV sport. Having been involved in its early stages, I've seen firsthand how far we've come, and I'm passionate about helping guide its future.

Vision for the sport of ATVing

The sport of ATVing is always changing, and we need to change with it. Riders and manufacturers continue to influence where the sport is headed, and it's important that we keep up. If we don't, we'll get left behind. We need to continue improving and maintaining our trail systems, expanding responsible riding opportunities, and promoting rider education and safety. We also need to keep

working with clubs, communities, land managers, local governments, and the DNR to protect and strengthen the future of our sport. Just as importantly, we need to attract the next generation of riders and volunteers. My vision is simple: keep moving the sport forward while protecting what we've all worked so hard to build.

Vision for ATV Minnesota

My vision for ATV Minnesota is to continue building a strong, unified organization that effectively represents the interests of riders, clubs, and communities across the state of Minnesota. I will accomplish this by continued advocacy in St. Paul to protect our sport at the State level. By continuing to support the established clubs as well as new clubs. I will continue to work with the DNR Leadership/Staff and the GIA program that is critical to our ATV clubs to keep things working at the local level. I will also continue to work towards a statewide director that will be available to us 24/7/365.





Perry May, Running For ATV MN President

Experience in the sport of

ATVing Purchased my first ATV in 2001 (Arctic Cat 400) to help with work around my property in Outing, Minn. Now own two Class 1 and one Class 2 ATVs. Became involved with the local club, (Over the Hills Gang) in 2008. Served as a Trail Coordinator, Vice President and Club President and now currently working as a Grant Manager. I have ridden over 50 Minnesota Grant-in-Aid (GIA) trails, and have ridden trails in Colorado and Wisconsin. I was a project manager for the creation of the Emily Outing and Emily

Blind Lake ATV Trails. I helped organize the first winter ATV rides in our area and helped implement Winter GIA. I have navigated the world of trail grants to help fund these trail projects. I have good working relationships with DNR personnel and county trail sponsors. I talk annually with members from Iowa OHV, Wisconsin WATVA, MI-Trale (UP Michigan). I attend TZD safety conferences and I am a Minnesota representative for RideSafe.

Experience with ATV Minnesota

Served as an ATVAM Regional Director (then Region 3), served 5 years on ATV MN executive board as ATV MN 2nd VP, 1st VP, and State Director. I currently serve on the ATV MN Safety Steering Committee, the GIA Improvement Committee, and the current club representative for Over the Hills Gang ATV Club. I have testified for ATV MN bills at the state capitol, notably the ATV Master Plan, the Northwoods Regional ATV Trail Improvement grants, and changing/eliminating the tire pressure ATV definition. I was the event lead for the 2022 Ride & Rally in Fifty Lakes, and helped guide the club hosting the 2025 Ride & Roast. I have facilitated a NOHVCC Great Trails Workshop in Isle, and planned another

workshop for the Nemadji area that was canceled due to Covid. I served on the MN Governors Outdoor Recreational Task Force, and I was selected as the 2019 NOHVCC Volunteer of the year. I have been a member of MMTC, and I helped at a CRTU event in Houston, Minn. I am an active, certified ATV safety instructor and volunteered as a DNR Trail Ambassador for 12 years. I have written dozens of articles for the Minnesota Wheelin magazine and ATV MN Newsletter, along with contributing pictures. I have planned and helped facilitate GIA workshops in Bemidji and Brainerd.

Involvement with ATV Clubs

I currently am a member of five ATV MN clubs (Over the Hills Gang, Eagle Country, Woodtick Wheelers, Cuyuna Iron Range Riders, Blind Lake) and a MnUSA member, and club member of the Emily Outing Snowbirds. As a State Director, I spoke with all the clubs and tried to visit them through regional meetings once a year. I write articles for Minnesota Wheelin on the various trails I have visited. I am a member of the 13-club Northwoods Regional ATV Trail Alliance, which was named NOHVCC 2025 Club/Association of the year. I maintain many club contacts around the state.

Reasons for seeking office

I was honored to have many individuals around the state ask me to run for ATV MN President. I believe I have the necessary leadership skills, experience, and relationships to bring ATV MN to a new level. A new level of professionalism, a new level of club engagement, member engagement, manufacturer engagement, and stakeholder engagement.

Personal Qualifications that apply to the responsibilities of the office

Five years of experience on the ATV MN Executive Board, along with 4 years as a Regional Director. (Leadership, Management, Communication, Delegation) I started my career as a technical school graduate working in machining, tool & die trades, and coaching college football when possible. I continued with my

education, completing a graduate degree in Manufacturing Systems Engineering. I worked for General Mills, a Fortune 500 company, for 31 years. As the Engineering Manager for an internal design & build group, I led a group of 50 employees building and installing proprietary process food equipment for General Mills, Nestle, PepsiCo, Want Want Foods, Lotte Confectionary, and Partners in Food Solutions. My work took me to 6 continents and hundreds of manufacturing sites around the world. My learnings included working with people that looked, acted and talked differently, but all continued working to common goals. I was responsible for annual department budgets of \$10 million and had input on capital programs that exceeded \$1 billion. Innovation, continuous improvement, communication, and execution were keys to success. Towards the end of my career, I was asked to manage the liquidation of assets from dozens of manufacturing sites. My learning: At some point, great ideas can have a limited shelf life, and organizations need to find closure and a path forward. I am a big believer in delegation, which not only involves more people in decision-making, but prepares the next organizational leaders.

Vision for the sport of ATVing

I would like to see the sport of motorized recreation continue outreach and education to non-members and to become a welcomed member into the world of outdoor recreation in Minnesota. This sport will continue to evolve, with new technologies, and new riders, and it is important that we seek riding opportunities for everyone, but not necessarily all on the same trail or trail system. I believe we must do a better job of promoting our sport while accepting our responsibility for leading ATV Safety and Environmental concerns. Our trail systems must prioritize connections, and we must develop a southern Minnesota trail/OHV park plan.

- Succession Plan for all E-Board positions including Communications Director

- Grow membership/ Set SMART Goals (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time Based)
- Prepare legislative priorities and communications plan by October for next legislative session
- Manufacturer & Dealer Relationship Building (Safety Open Houses)
- Outreach to non-ATV MN members
- Strengthening GIA Program to support Maintenance, Trail Improvements, New Trails •Embrace ATV Safety as key organizational goal (Class 2 Safety Training)
- Develop secondary or complementary funding sources to GIA
- An actionable plan to grow trails or parks in all regions of Minnesota, and build new trails as funding allows, and making use of the MN OHV Strategic Mater Plan.

Experience in the sport of ATVing

ATV riding for me has been a lifelong journey. I received my first ATV at the age of 10 years old, and put many miles on it riding around my parents backyard as well as out on our hunting property. I now spend my free time sharing my passion with anyone and everyone in hopes of helping others enjoy not just the ATV experience but also the entire ATV community that I have grown to know and love.

Experience with ATV Minnesota

I have been a member of ATV Minnesota since 2012 and have attended many ATV MN events, including Ride & Roast, Ride & Rally, Legislative Summit, Grant-in-Aid workshops, Vision Conferences, and other ATV MN sponsored events. I have been a member of the communications team for years and have helped build the Minnesota Wheelin magazine, as well as helped manage the ATV MN social media account. With the communications team I have designed many event flyers, banners, and signage. I have also written many articles for the Minnesota Wheelin and e-newsletter. I have worked with David Halsey on building a large library of photos and videos that we use in many of our publications, as well as for the Minnesota DNR and Minnesota tourism publications. Most recently I took on the roll as a Regional Director and have attended the monthly board meetings as well as multiple area ATV MN club meetings to check in with clubs in my region.

Involvement with ATV Clubs

Since 2012 I have been working with various ATV clubs around my area as well as around the state. I have been a club member to a half a dozen different ATV clubs, and helped many more with various projects. Currently I am a member of Central Lakes ATV Club, Cuyuna Iron Range Riders, Over the Hills Gang ATV Club and Finland Snowmobile and ATV Club. Over the past 14 years I have helped clubs with trail maintenance, new trail construction, storm clean ups, club rides and events, Trail Ambassador rides, and youth ATV safety training. I have also attended many meetings on behalf of the clubs, as well as helped design and print promotional items, flyers, and banners for many club events throughout the state. Spent many hours promoting club involvement and pushed for new opportunities for community outreach with the clubs.

Reasons For Seeking Office

I am seeking this position because I feel like the sport of ATV riding is a vital piece to our lifestyle here in Minnesota. I would like to help be part of building lasting relationships with new riders, existing members, communities statewide,

industry leaders, and legislators to help ensure that ATV riders have the right to continue enjoying the recreational opportunities we have, as well as continue to grow the sport in a responsible manner.

Personal Qualifications

Over my 20 year career as a construction boilermaker, I have spent a lot of time traveling the country, working on many complex projects. I later transitioned into the Boilermakers trade and graduated as a Journeyman Boilermaker, where I spent the last 8 years of my construction career in site supervision. Managing major construction project for clients like Xcel Energy, Minnesota Power, Cleveland Cliffs, U.S. Steel and many others. Managed nuclear reactor re-fuelings and oil refinery turnarounds. Many of these projects were long-term construction/maintenance projects that required a vast amount of planning and preparation, as well as EPA compliance and strict safety guidelines. Good relationship building and clear communication were expected on all assets of these projects.

Founder of Minnesota ATV Riders. On March 25th of 2014 I took on the task of trying to build a community where riders could come together and share their stories, experiences and information with each other through the Minnesota ATV Riders. What started as a social media based community has grow into a non-profit organization that prides itself on sharing fun, responsible, and sustainable ATV recreation. Managing multiple social media accounts and building dozens of relationships with industry personnel.

Founder of Northern Off-Road Productions. Took on the dream of building a seasonal event that gets riders together to strengthen our ATV community. Building and maintaining dozens and dozens of relationships, and partnerships with industry partners, tourism bureaus, ATV clubs/organizations, and lodging destinations.

Vision for the sport of ATVing

My vision of ATVing in Minnesota is to see continuous growth in riding opportunities as well as promotion of safety and involvement from riders, communities, and industry to work together and enhance the sport for all who want to enjoy it. I see trail improvements in the future, new trail development in more regions of the state, new stronger relationships built across all facets as well as working with legislators to protect our rights as ATV riders so many generations to come can continue to make lifelong memories.

Experience in the sport of ATVing

Regional Directors & Bluff Country ATV Club Attend Charity Ride

The Caledonia fire department hosted their 4th annual charity ride on Saturday, August 1st. Over 250 machines and 700 hundred people came out to support the Caledonia Fire Mud and Dust Ride, to raise money for individuals or families facing medical hardships.

Riders from across Minnesota, Iowa and Wisconsin parked at the Caledonia fairground in Houston County. Everyone gathered as members from the fire department gave the pre-ride safety instructions: stay on all marked trail routes and watch for the rider behind you. They also recognized the 38 landowners that opened their private land for people to ride. They sold raffles tickets for the grand prize of a four-seat Can-Am side-by-side.

The ride was very well organized with people all along the trail routes and intersections to guide riders along. The group rode 65 miles and made four stops to enjoy the forest hills and scenery. The trail routes went through cattle pastures, along beautiful scenic bluffs, and farmers' corn and soybean fields. The riders enjoyed a sunny summer day and watching some grazing cattle along the way.

At the last stop, riders enjoyed a pulled pork sandwich, chips, dessert bars and bottled water, hosted by the local 4-H club. Members from ATV Minnesota and the Bluff Country ATV Club were present, handing out ATV trail atlases, OHV regulations books, and Minnesota Wheelin magazines. Thank you to all the landowners, the Caledonia volunteer fire department, the businesses that donated, and all the volunteers that made this happen. Caledonia is a city in Houston County located about two and half hours south of the Twin Cities.
